The National Maritime Museum first opened in 1937, although the building was originally used as a school for children of seafarers during the 1800s, and has since been declared as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

The NMM also contains the world's largest maritime library and archive collection. It has the most important holdings in the world on the history of Britain at sea with more than two million items.

Today the NMM attracts more than 750,000 visitors each year. Discover epic stories of exploration and that have shaped our world today.
